Title: PER – 320 Personal Protective Measures for Biological Events

Description: This course focuses on the challenges faced by first responders and clinical health care professionals in pre-hospital and hospital environments as they deal with personal protective equipment (PPE) needs and potential contamination issues when working with highly infectious diseases. Personal Protective Measures for Biological Events provides students with an overview of personal protective equipment (PPE), and includes an experiential learning activity (ELA) practicing donning and doffing PPE Level C.

Topics:

- Hazards specific to infectious disease incidents in a health care setting
- Exposure control plans
- Best safe work practices and most current guidance from the Centers of Disease Control and the World Health Organization
- Use and limitations of personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Donning and doffing of appropriate levels of PPE to include practice with representative Level C PPE
- Roles and responsibilities
- Technical decontamination processes and procedures

Intended Audience: Responders and receivers such as: Emergency Medical Services, Public Health, Hospitals, Law Enforcement, and County/State/Federal responders
